

Sempervivum 'Lavender Ice'

Characteristics

Genus & Species: Sempervivum hybrid Protection Status:Rights Asserted.

USDA Zone: Zone 3. (-40°F or -40°C).

Bloom: Foliage selection, slow to flower. Pink star shaped flowers, held in clusters, on stout fleshy stems.

Bloom Time: Mid-late summer.

Foliage: Unique icy silver rosettes flushed with lavender and pink tones. Vivid pink stems carry multiple

offsets (chicks).

Habit: Clumping perennial with multiple offsets (Chicks). 6-8" x 10-12".

Propagation: TC & Offsets. License required for propagation.

Culture: Well-drained soil in full sun for best color.

Additional Comments: Drought tolerant once established. Common name: Hen and Chicks.

Uses: Low-water Containers, Garden Border, Xeriscape landscapes.

Approximate Finishing Time

1 Gallon: 6-8 weeks 2 Gallon: 10-12 weeks
