Genus & Species: Lavandula stoechas (Code: 1385)

Protection Status: Rights Asserted.

USDA Zone: USDA Zone 8. (15°F or -12°C).

Bloom: Unique saturdated deep pink flowers.

Bloom Period: Early spring – fall.

Foliage: Grey-green aromatic foliage.

Habit: Tight compact mounding habit 24" x 24".

Propagation: Softwood Cuttings. *License required for propagation.*

Culture: Full sun, well-drained soil.

Additional Comments: Drought tolerant once established. Attracts bees and butterflies.

Uses: Containers, borders, mass landscape planting.

Approximate Finishing Time

1 Quart: 6-8 weeks 1 Gallon: 10-12 weeks
